Arsenal's record for most league goals in a season is 127, set in the title-winning season of 1930/31. The fewest league goals Arsenal have conceded in a season is 18, in the 1990/91 championship season.

* On December 14, 1935 Ted Drake scored a record seven goals in Arsenal's 7-1 win over Aston Villa at Villa Park. Jack Wilshere became the youngest player to represent Arsenal in league football when he made his debut against Blackburn on September 13, 2008. He was 16 and 256 days old.

* Thierry Henry won the Premier League Golden Boot four years out of five between 2001 and 2006. Arsenal's first-ever fixture (as Dial Square) was a friendly against Eastern Wanderers on December 11, 1886. * In Arsenal's title-winning 1990/91 season, David Seaman, Nigel Winterburn, Lee Dixon and Steve

Bould all started every one of the Club's 50 games in all competitions. Thierry Henry is Arsenal's most capped player of all time, having won 81 caps for France while with the Club. * Gunners Legend John Radford is the Club's youngest-ever hat-trick scorer. He was 17 years 315 days, when scoring three against Wolves

at Highbury on January 2, 1965. As at the start of the 2009/10 season, 776 players had represented the Arsenal first team. * Cesc Fabregas is Arsenal's youngest-ever player, making his debut at 16 years and 177 days v Rotherham in the Carling Cup in October 2003. Arsenal Ladies set a record of 58

consecutive wins in major domestic competition before losing to Everton in the 2008 League Cup Final. * 20 different players scored for the first-team last season, a record for most scorers in a season for the Club. Arsène Wenger is the only Arsenal manager to have won four FA Cups, and is the second most successful

manager in the competition. * Arsenal remained unbeaten for 18 consecutive FA Cup games between 2001 and 2004 – a post-war record. In September 2006 Emirates Stadium hosted the first-ever friendly between Brazil and Argentina to take place outside of South America. * Arsenal Under-18s won the FA

Youth Cup last season – their seventh success in the competition. No team has won more FA Youth Cups over the past 50 years. When Arsenal beat Blackburn Rovers 3-0 on August 25, 2004, they set a new record for consecutive unbeaten league matches, breaking Nott'm Forest's sequence of 42 from 1978.
