The City Police (Stadtpolizei) welcomes you to St.Gallen. This guide contains all relevant information you need to make your stay in St.Gallen a pleasant one.

Arrival by plane

You can reach St.Gallen from the airport in Zurich in about an hour by train or by car.

Traffic and infrastructure

The Kybunpark stadium can be reached via the A1 motorway directly (exit St.Gallen-Winkeln). The motorways are subject to tolls. You can buy a motorway charge sticker (vignette) for CHF 40 at customs or in petrol station shops. It is valid for one year. The maximum speed on the motorway is 120 km/h.

A limited number of chargeable parking spaces are available in the stadium parking lot.

Public transport

From St.Gallen main station you can reach the stadium within 15 minutes by bus using the line 151 or 158. Depending on the occasion, an extra bus will be provided (check for signs).

Entry requirements

Make sure to check in advance which identity documents are required for Switzerland. In the event of a police check, you will have to be able to identify yourself at any time. Via www.ch.ch/en you can check which travel documents are required to enter Switzerland.

Alcohol consumption in road traffic

In Switzerland, vehicle drivers are fined for a blood alcohol concentration of 0.50‰ or more or a breath alcohol concentration of 0.25 mg/l or more. A complete ban on driving under the influence of alcohol applies to professional drivers.

Narcotics

Violations of the Narcotics Act are punished by a fine and/or a custodial sentence (imprisonment), depending on the quantity and type of narcotics. Spirits, alcopops and distilled water may only be consumed from the age of 18.

Pyrotechnics

Carrying along and lighting fireworks of any kind is strictly forbidden at sports events and will be punished systematically.

Covering

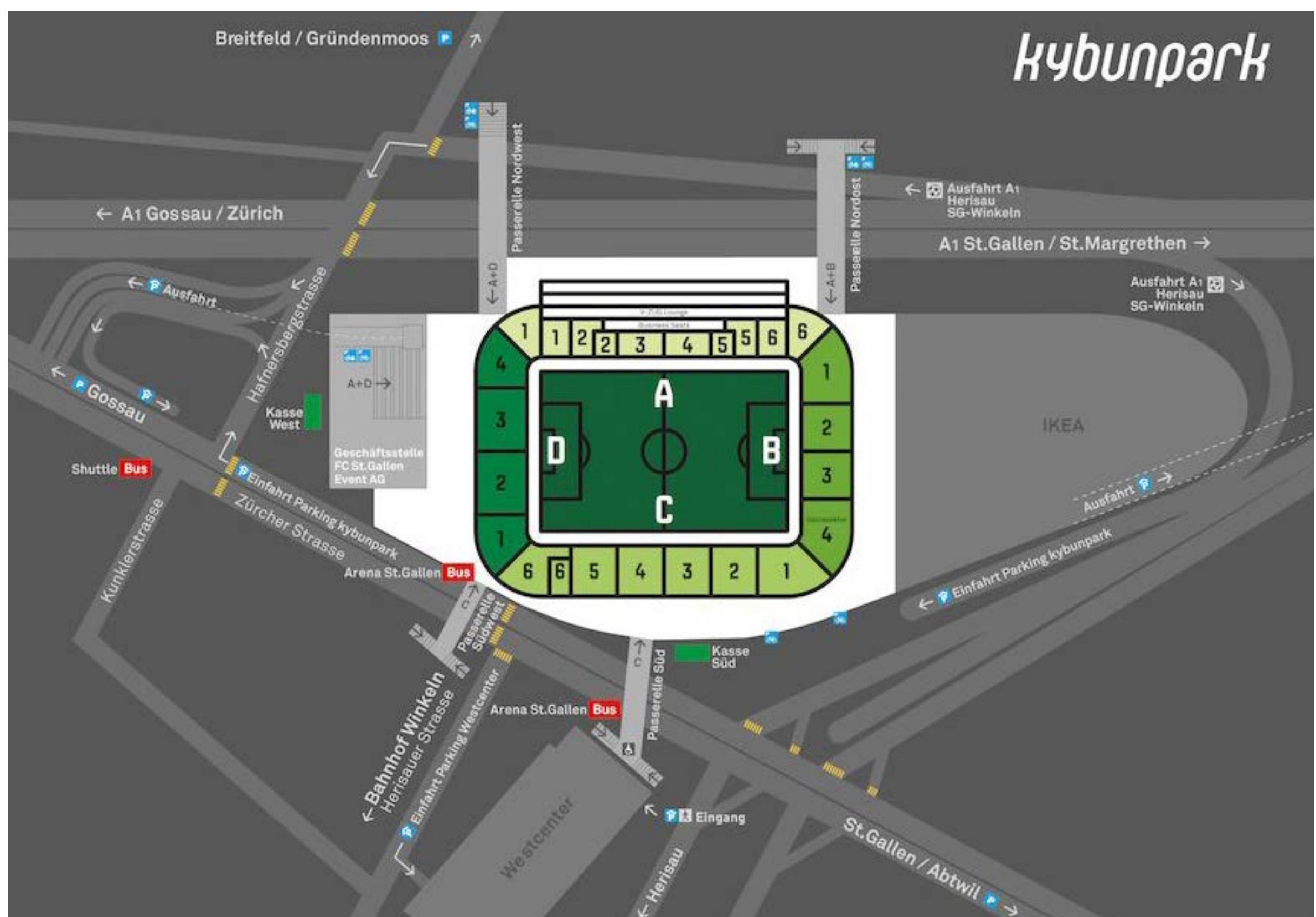
In St.Gallen it is forbidden to make one's face unrecognizable.

Medical care

Medical care is guaranteed. The European Health Insurance Card must be presented for medical and hospital treatment.

Stadium and surroundings

The Kybunpark football stadium (opened in 2008) is situated in the west of St.Gallen and has a maximum capacity of 19 568 seats and standing places. It is used to host FC St.Gallen 1879 championship matches and international football matches (17 317 seats). The different sectors and the respective accesses are shown in the following diagram.

Means of payment

Around the stadium there are various beverage and food stands where you can pay with cash or cards.

In the stadium, payment is only possible by credit card or maestro card.

Fan retention

To ensure that the various fans can leave the stadium in a safe and orderly manner, you can leave the stadium at the earliest 30 minutes after the end of the match. The beverage and food stands will remain open during that time.

City of St.Gallen

With around 80 000 inhabitants, the city of St.Gallen is the 8th largest city in Switzerland and offers a number of other sights. If you would like to spend time before and after the game in a bar or restaurant, the old town of St.Gallen is the perfect place to go to. Here you will find classic pubs, modern bars, cafés and cosy home-style restaurants.
